1. **All rabbits must be tattooed prior to rabbit check-in.**
Tattooing will be available the third Monday in June at 7 pm at the Ionia Fairgrounds.
2. Rabbits will arrive on Saturday between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The show will be held on Saturday, starting at 3:00 p.m. If an exhibitor has a problem bringing their animals at this time, please contact the superintendent in writing before the start of the Fair.
3. Each member is required to do a record book. These complete books are to be turned in at check-in. **No Book, No Check-In.**
4. No diseased animals will be accepted for exhibit. If a disagreement arises over the health of an animal, a veterinarian, at the exhibitor's expense, will examine the animal.
5. Rabbits must be in the exhibitor's possession by May 1 and market pen does must be in exhibitor's possession by April 1 of the current year. There is **NO** sharing of animals outside of immediate family; brothers and sisters.
6. Each exhibitor may enter up to five (5) pens, this includes their market project.
7. Only rabbits entered and shown in 4-H during the Fair will be allowed in the barn.
8. **NO** "For Sale" signs will be allowed on show rabbits until the market sale is over. Families may not bring rabbits from home to sell. Rabbits housed in the 4-H barn must be housed, during the entire Fair, in the 4-H barn. 4-H rabbits may not be moved to another barn. 4-H rabbits housed in the open barn must remain there for the entire Fair.
9. Each barn duty shift must have an adult in the crew. Release time will be on the last Sunday of the Fair at 11:00 a.m. with clean-up to immediately follow. You or your representative must be present to pick up your rabbits and clean your share of the barn.
10. ALL 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year rabbit exhibitors must show a rabbit in showmanship. All exhibitors must show in at least two different rabbit events, with the exception of the costume class.
11. All classes will be judged by ARBA rules. **JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL!**
12. ALL PENS MUST BE CLEANED PRIOR TO EXHIBITOR LEAVING THE GROUNDS.
13. Exhibitors showing in the Ionia County 4-H Rabbit Show must adhere to the State 4-H Dress Code Guidelines.
14. Any requests of the superintendent must be made in writing 24 hours in advance.

15. Exhibitors participating in the Ionia County 4-H Rabbit Program may not show rabbits through 4-H in any other county
16. Fair during the current year. Violators may not participate the following year in the Ionia Free Fair.
17. It is encouraged that all exhibitors and parents attend one county-wide rabbit meeting.
18. No medicating of animals will be allowed while at the Fair.

Progeny

1. Entry in this class will consist of two (2) animals owned by the same 4-H exhibitor (mother and offspring).
 2. **Animals cannot be shared for the Progeny Class (Junior or Senior Class).**
 3. One shall be the mother (may be raised or purchased by the exhibitor) and the second animal shall be one of its offspring raised (not purchased) by the 4-H exhibitor.
 4. Offspring must be ten (10) weeks to six (6) months of age.
 5. The offspring is required to stay and be housed at the Fair. It is also to be shown in its respective breed class.
 6. The mother is not required to stay at the Fair or be shown in its breed class.
 7. **A complete pedigree must be made on the offspring and submitted upon showing. No pedigrees submitted will result in the entire project being ineligible for judging in the class. All breeds and varieties must be recognized by the ARBA.**

Market Rabbits

1. **Exhibitor may only enter one (1) market pen. (Pen of 3 or a single fryer.)**
2. Market pen must be bred and raised by exhibitor; weight limit is from 3 ½ pounds to 5 ½ pounds; age limit, not over 70 days old. Doe must be in exhibitor's possession by April 1 of the current year. Exhibitor must be sole owner of the doe (no partnerships outside of immediate family; brothers and sisters).
3. Exhibitors of a market project, must also exhibit their records found in their project record book. **Record books must be completed and turned in at the time of weigh-in. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
4. Any pen eliminated or disqualified of the show table, will not be sold. Judge's decision is final.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for processing and delivery to their buyer(s) within two (2) weeks after the sale or their sale check will be withheld.
6. A sale charge will be deducted from the selling prices.
7. **Only one market unit can be sold at the auction for personal profit (rabbit market pen, poultry market pen, or eggs).**
8. Grand and Reserve Champion units will sell. Should an individual receive Grand and Reserve Champion in more than one category, they must designate unit to be sold for personal profit by noon on the Sunday following judging.
9. Weigh-in will be conducted in the order of arrival. **No parent may weigh-in their child's pen.**
10. There will be no addition or subtraction of weight.
11. The decision of the weigh-in committee at the time of weigh-in is final. The first three (3) rabbits presented are the Market Pen. Exhibitors will not be allowed to switch rabbits if one of the first three is disqualified.
12. Under or over weight pens are given a C-rating and may stay at the Fair if there is enough room. These pens will not go to the show table.
13. Market pens must all be the same breed and variety (color).
14. All exhibitors/sellers of market pens must have at least three (3) photos taken the night of the sale.
15. Exhibitors must show and sell their own animals.
16. If pedigrees are available; it will be between the buyer and the seller.
17. If a market rabbit is donated back to the exhibitor, the rabbit or its offspring must be exhibited at the next Fair.
18. Market pens will be judged by ARBA rules and standards.
19. All market pen rabbits must be tattooed with the Ionia County 4-H tattoo. Tattooing will be held on the third Monday in June at 7 pm at the Ionia Fairgrounds.
20. First year exhibitors are not eligible to exhibit market pens. A 4-H member may show a rabbit and/or poultry market pen if he/she is nine (9) years of age (4-H age), has been a full 4-H member or a Cloverbud for one year, AND has participated in that species showmanship for at least one year.
21. **All 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year exhibitors must show a rabbit in showmanship. All exhibitors in the market rabbit project must show in at least one other class in Department H, with the exception of the Costume Class.**
22. If an exhibitor brings a market pen of three (3) rabbits and one or two rabbits do not make weight, the exhibitor may show and sell one rabbit as a market rabbit fryer. A single fryer entry is eligible for an A rating, but will not be eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion. A market rabbit project book must be completed. All market rabbit rules apply.
23. An exhibitor may bring a single fryer (3-6 lbs.) in lieu of a pen of three (3).
24. On a 4-H member's last year as an active member, they may show and sell 2 of the 3 following market projects; a rabbit or poultry (chicken, duck, turkey, goose) pen and a dozen eggs IF they have shown in that species at least one year. They will also have to sign a statement stating this is their last year.
