General Rules for Still Exhibit Project Exhibitors Departments 18M—18X

- 1. Pre-entry forms are required for all still exhibits.
- 2. Each still exhibit must have an entry tag attached to each project.
- 3. <u>Exhibitors should be present for judging if at all possible.</u> If not able to be present, 4-H members with still exhibits may bring their project to the Ionia MSUE Office at another time to be interviewed. This interview will be video tapes and the video will be shown to judges on judging day. The 4-Her will be judged just as they would if they were present and will not be penalized.
- 4. All projects must be done with your 4-H club. No school projects will be accepted.
- 5. Awards will be based on the Danish System of A, B, or C Ratings.
- 6. Any 4-H member not following rules specified in the Fair book, including display requirements will be reduced one rating.
- 7. Judges decisions will be final.
- 8. "Outstanding" ribbons can be awarded for projects of excellence.
- 9. Up to one "Best of Show" award may be awarded per project area.
- 10. Hot and frozen dish exhibitors will be allowed to move to the front of the line for that project.
- 11. Each educational exhibit must include a poster or a 3-D display plus a notebook or workbook. The exhibitor must make this exhibit in their project area. Posters can be any size, but should not be larger than 22 inches by 28 inches.
- 12. All still exhibits must be picked up between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. the Sunday following the Fair. If a member is unable to pick up a project at this time, arrangements must be made for someone else to pick up the project. Still exhibits not picked up will be discarded.

- All collections must be mounted or ready for display in a neat, orderly fashion. Must add to the original collection each year and update your original written description in a notebook.
- 4. Collections of great value (coins, stamps, etc.) must be brought to judging day but will not be exhibited during Fair week.
- Valuable collection exhibitors should supply a picture of their collection to be exhibited during Fair week.
- 6. If the collection takes more than a two-foot square of space, please bring a photo to exhibit.
- 7. Please specify collection type on the exhibit it tag.

Cultural Arts

- 1. School projects are not eligible.
- 2. All exhibits must be done in 4-H club work.
- 3. May enter one exhibit per class.
- 4. A 5 to 10 minute videotaped demonstration or skit must be provided for Clowning and Dramatics.
- 5. Must provide own TV and VCR or computer (A laptop can be provided upon request by calling the MSU Extension office **prior** to the Fair.)
- 6. Entries will be judged on their demonstration or skit, make-up, costumes, props, acting and audience involvement.
- 7. A record book is required for each performer.
- 8. All art projects must be matted or framed and ready to hang.
- Exhibits not conforming to standards listed will be dropped by one letter rating.

Clowning

- Open to all 4-H members currently enrolled in the 4-H clowning project.
- One clowning record book is required for each performer. A clowning record book may be picked up at the MSU Extension Office.

Photography

- Member must have knowledge of the type of camera that is used and be able to discuss with judge.
- Member must be able to discuss techniques learned when taking photographs. Example: composition, lighting/ flash, focusing, zoom, action shots, angle shots, storing your photos in albums, on DVD's, etc.
- 4. All photo's must be mounted on a ½ (11x14) white poster board.
- 5. Do not use corner mounts, they do not hold up well in Quonset.
- 6. Use photo spray adhesive, no rubber cement.
- 7. No writing, drawing, clip art on poster board.
- First year members <u>must</u> enter class number 5381; they may also enter other classes.
- 9. Do not use corner mounts; use rubber cement around edges of photo only.
- 10. Entries not meeting each of the requirements will be marked down one ribbon rating.
