



Egg Project Information

- Collect a dozen eggs that are of similar color, shape and size. (From 1 or 2 birds over several weeks.)
- Thoroughly wash eggs. Eggs must be free of blemishes and cracks.
- Place eggs in a clean carton with air sac on top, (pointed end down).
- If sold at fair, bring the buyer a fresh dozen eggs. The eggs do not have to be the same.


Market Project Weight Gain and Growth Chart
